# Hazard Mitigation Assistance

#### **Hazard Mitigation Grant Program**

- Match: 75/12/13
- Eligible Applicants: city and county governments, special districts, private non-profits
- Property Acquisition and Structure Demolition, Property Acquisition and Structure Relocation, Structure Elevation, Mitigation Reconstruction, Dry Flood Proofing of Historic Residential Structures, Dry Flood Proofing of Non-Residential Structures, Localized and Non-localized Flood Risk Reduction Projects, Structural Retrofitting of Existing Buildings and Facilities, Safe Room Construction, Wind Retrofit for one and two Family Residences, Infrastructure Retrofit, Soil Stabilization, Wildfire Mitigation, and Post Disaster Code Enforcement, Generators, Alert Sirens, Weather Radios, etc.

# **Building Resiliency Infrastructure and Communities**

- Match: 75/25
- Eligible Applicants: city and county governments
- Capability and Capacity Building activities, Mitigation Projects



### **Disaster Grants**

#### **Flood Mitigation Assistance**

• Match: 75/25

- Eligible Applicants: city and county governments
- Must participate in NFIP
- Community Flood Mitigation Projects are local level drainage/flood control projects to improve drainage and reduce flood risk for communities and can include numerous activities such as drainage pipes, pump stations, topographic grading, seawalls, marsh restoration, and other nature-based solutions.
- Individual Structure/Property-Level Flood Mitigation Projects: Individual flood mitigation projects are those that mitigate the risk of flooding to individual NFIPinsured structures and give priority to properties meeting SRL and RL definitions. These project types include Acquisition, Acquisition Relocation, Relocation, Elevation, Mitigation Reconstruction, and Dry floodproofing of historic or commercial structures.

### **Law Enforcement Protection Program**

- Eligible applicants: cities, counties, local government police departments, public university safety and security departments, sheriff's departments, and special law enforcement officers attached to school districts.
- Eligible Projects: Body armor; Duty weapons and ammunition; Electronic control devices; electronic control weapons; or electro-muscular disruption technology; and Body worn cameras
- Due: Rolling Deadline



# Kentucky State Homeland Security Grant Program

- Eligible Applicants: city and county governments, area development districts, local taxing districts, and public school districts
- Eligible Projects: Combating Domestic Violent Extremism, Enhancing Cybersecurity, Enhancing the Protection of Soft Targets/Crowded Places, Community Preparedness & Resilience, Election Security, Emergency Communications and Emergency Medical Service Equipment
- Match: None



### Kentucky Office of Highway Safety Grants

- Eligible applicants: Local and State Law Enforcement Agencies, Private Institutions of higher education, and Non-Law Enforcement Agencies, such as Health Departments and Hospitals.
- Eligible projects: all agencies are required to fulfill each of the following objectives to aid in the accomplishment of Statewide goals: impaired driving, occupant protection, and police traffic services.
- Match: None



Community Oriented Policing Services
Hiring Program

- Eligible applicants: all local, state, and tribal law enforcement agencies.
- Provides 75 percent of the approved entry-level salaries and fringe benefits of each newly hired and/or rehired fulltime officer, up to \$125,000 per officer position, over the three-year (36 month) grant period
- Match: 25% local cash match



# Community Policing Development Microgrants

- Eligible applicants: all local, state, and tribal law enforcement agencies.
- Eligible projects: Hate Crimes; Human
   Trafficking; Meeting Rural Law Enforcement
   Challenges; Officer Safety and Wellness;
   Recruitment; Hiring; and Retention; School
   Safety, Staffing and Allocation Studies;
   Victim-Centered Approaches; Violent Crime;
   and Youth Engagement.
- Match: None



### KY 911 Services Board Grant

- Eligible applicants: PSAP's
- Eligible projects: Geospatial and mapping projects, Host/remote projects, CAD, CPE, Radio, Radio Console/Recorder, other (per 202 KAR 6:090), multi-jurisdictional projects, Regional IP networks, Emerging technology/innovation.
- Projects MUST be consistent with NG 911
   Road Map & NG 911 Mapping Guide
- Match: None



### **Volunteer Fire Assistance Grant**

- Eligible Applicants: rural fire departments in communities with a population of 10,000 persons or less.
- Eligible Items: training materials; pumps; hoses; tanks; small fire suppression equipment; personal protective equipment (PPE), such as Nomex®, fire shelters, gloves, lights, etc.
- Match: 50%



### Assistance to Firefighters Grant (AFG)

- Eligible Applicants: Fire Departments, nonaffiliated EMS organizations, State Fire Training Academies
- Eligible Projects: Operations and Safety, Vehicle Acquisition, Regional Projects
- Match: 5%-15% depending on population size



# Staffing for Adequate Fire and Emergency Response (SAFER)

- Hiring of Firefighters Activity is to hire new, additional firefighters to improve staffing levels or changing the status of part-time or paid-on-call firefighters to full-time firefighters. The period of performance will be 36 months for all grants awarded under the Hiring of Firefighters Activity.
- Recruitment and Retention of Volunteer
  Firefighters Activity is to assist fire departments
  with the recruitment and retention of volunteer
  firefighters who are involved with or trained in the
  operations of firefighting and emergency response.
  The period of performance will be between 12 and
  48 months for all grants awarded under the
  Recruitment and Retention of Volunteer
  Firefighters Activity.
- Match: Varies



### Fire Prevention and Safety Grant (FP&S)

- Eligible Applicants: Fire departments; and national, regional, state, local, federally recognized tribal, and non-profit organizations that are recognized for their experience and expertise in fire prevention and safety programs and activities. Both private and public non-profit organizations are eligible to apply for funding in this activity.
- Eligible Activities: Community Risk Reduction, Code Enforcement/Awareness, Fire & Arson Investigation, and National/State/Regional/ Programs & Studies
- Match: 5%



### **CDBG**

### **Community Projects**

Eligible Projects: Volunteer Fire Stations

Funding: Maximum of \$750,000

Match: 15% - Priority I

10% - Priority II

<10% - Priority III



### **USDA RD**

Eligible Projects: Development of community facilities in rural areas such as new police cars/radios; expansion of fire departments; construction/renovation of community centers & libraries

Eligible applicants: public bodies, nonprofits, federally recognized Indian tribes. City, town or unincorporated area of not more than 20,000 in population.

Match: Grant eligibility is based on income, population and need. Varies from community.
