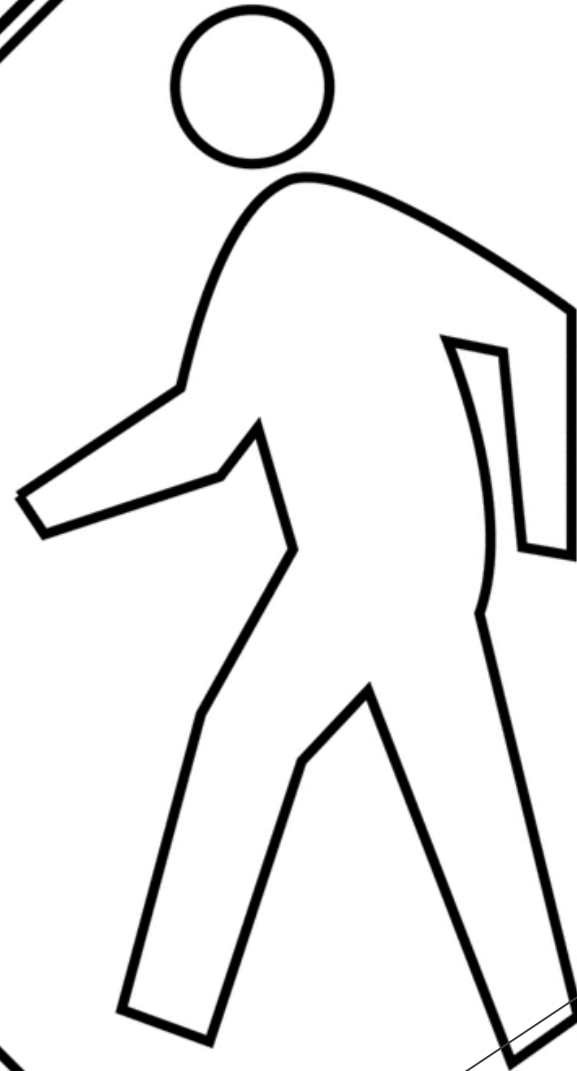
Auburn Pedestrian Park Improvement Project
